our Park business is not over! We have some significant tasks ahead of us. Our election to replace 3 positions for the 2021 BOD is underway. September 5th is our Election Day so please send in your ballots! Ballots are in the mail and should be returned by the September 5th deadline to meet the By-law requirements of the Saturday before Labor Day election. Hand delivered Ballots will also be accepted on that Saturday the 5th between 9-10am. All ballots will be unopened and secured in a Ballot Box until that morning. The ballots will be counted by a specially designated team and the official pronouncement of the elected members will be announced at approximately 2pm that Saturday. The new board will confirm the 2021 President who will then appoint the Board members to their positions to go into effect April 1, 2021. The newly elected representatives will serve 2-year positions. As in last year's election we have a slate of nominees that is equal to the open positions, Linda Hackett, Tom Hutchinson and Keith Johnson. So, it is pretty obvious who will comprise our next BOD. Karen Cantrell, Carole Winter and Jim Zilaro are the returning BOD members; Rory Riff and Kathy Gibson will be retiring. The results of the election will be posted on the bulletin boards and noted in the October Pipeline. Bobby Privette has volunteered his time to fill in the position of Water/Sewer through this season. A huge thanks for his time and many talents. Also, a big thank you to the nominating

committee chaired by Teresa Rogers and supported this year by Lynn Harris and Linda Hackett. Many hours were spent canvassing this year to develop our candidate list.

Water and Sewer – Bobby Privette



Most of you know by now that I am back on the Board and in charge of Water and Sewer again. I have agreed to serve in this capacity until the beginning of the next season. I had to hit the ground running. My first day back on the board I woke up to find we had no water on Side 2. The booster pump had gone bad. A half day later we had water again with a temporary pump installed. The old pump is being rebuilt – less expensive than a new one. Since then we have had two sewer clogs, a water line leak repaired, and a park model flooded. Also, we have had American Water and Sewer in to replace a leaking main valve on Side 2. They also went throughout Side 1 methodically, checking each section to verify which lots were controlled by each valve. They will be updating the water line maps which will help us be more accurate when repairs are needed. If you have questions about our water and sewer systems or problems which need to be addressed, please feel free to call me.

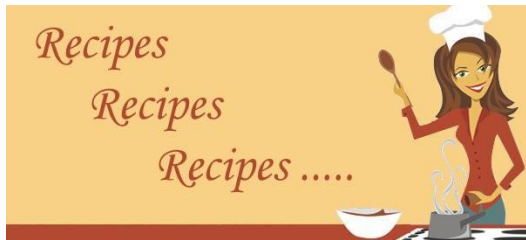
write a Great American classic. What could go wrong?

The Easiest Peanut Butter Fudge Recipe Ever

Town Creek:

Town Creek is a State of Georgia regulated trout stream and all State Laws and regulations apply to the use of this stream. No fishing is permitted from the bridge. Anyone 16 or older is required to have a fishing license and trout stamp (see state regulations). The building of any kind of dam or the moving of LARGE stones in the creek is strictly prohibited. No trees or vegetation of any kind is to be removed from the sides of Town Creek.



Use of Pavilion:

The Pavilion may be used for private functions by the Campground members. Private functions will not be permitted if the function is on the same day as a regularly scheduled Campground activity/event. For rental information please contact a Board of Directors Member, there is a \$50.00 deposit required.



No tent, canopy, screen room or camping is allowed on common areas of the park!!

**** There could be fines associated with the violation of rules and regulations of the park. Please check your own copy for those fines. ****

First Offense: If the owners are in the park, two Board of Directors will speak to the owner. If the owner is not in the park, they will contact the owner via phone/email.

Second Offense: A letter will be written to the owner.

Third Offense: A fine will be imposed for violation of rule.

Oktoberfest 50th celebration postponed until 2021

The Greater Helen Area Chamber of Commerce has announced that they are postponing their 50th Anniversary celebration of Oktoberfest until 2021. Because the Festhalle is considered a live performance event facility under guidelines set by the State of Georgia for COVID-10 reopening, and for the safety of employees and tourists who visit the area, the decision was made to postpone the celebration, the Chamber said in a press release. "This has been an extremely difficult decision," the Chamber said in a press release. "No one could have imagined a situation that would cause us to cancel the Festhalle celebrations for our 50th Anniversary, and all options were looked at prior to reaching our decision. The businesses we represent are still open for you. We still have some of the best restaurants you will find anywhere. Our beautiful mountains are still here. We love our visitors and we welcome them. We are hopeful that other celebrations can safely continue. Because of the size of our venue, the concerns expressed by our entertainers who would have to travel here to perform, and the expectation of what a Festhalle celebration should be (filled dance floors, beer lines, food lines, dancing parades through the hall, etc.), we see no way to proceed. Despite our wishes and best efforts, we do not

believe we would be able to provide an appropriate 50th Anniversary celebration for our visitors and still maintain required safety protocols. It would not be possible for the Festhalle experience this year to come close to what we are known for or what is expected."
