Register on PVCOA.COM Go to "Info/Log-in" and then in the upper righthand corner one can "register" to receive notifications of Activities, Water & Sewer, Grounds, general Board of Director announcements, access to forms, financials,



covenants, rules, and bylaws. Some pages may be password protected, so you will want to register for an account to access these.





We all know that our favorite way to get around the park is in our Golf Cart! Did you know, per the PVC Rules #5: Golf carts are to be operated only by a licensed driver 16 years of age or older. Owners of golf carts are fully responsible

for any injury to person and/or property. Golf carts must display the owner's lot number and, when driven after dark, must be equipped with working headlights and either taillights or rear reflectors. No cart may be driven on private property (other than the cart owner's) nor on greenbelt area. (Fine: \$25.00)

Guests: Lot owners are

responsible to ensure their guests/renters abide by all campground rules and regulations and must provide a copy of the rules to anyone using or renting their lot. (Fine: \$25.00)





Pets: All pets must be on a leash at all times when on common property. Owners must pick up after their pets. Barking dogs must be controlled by their

owners so as not to be a nuisance to neighbors. Due to Paradise Valley's insurance company regulations, the following canines will no longer be allowed in the campground by owners or renters: Staffordshire Terrier, American Terrier, Bull Terrier, Doberman Pinscher, German Shepherd, Rottweiler or any combination thereof. In addition, any dog (regardless of breed or size) with bite history and/or any dog used for the purpose of guarding the premises will also be prohibited. No dogs shall be tied and/or left unattended outside on property. (Fine: \$25.00)
