1 box French vanilla cake mix 1 pint coffee ice cream, melted 3 eggs

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Coat standard bundt cake pan with cooking spray and dust with flour; shake out excess. With electric mixer beat cake mix, melted ice cream and eggs until smooth. Bake at 350 for 35 to 40

Frosting:

1 pkg. (8 oz.) crm. Cheese <sup>1</sup>⁄<sub>4</sub> Cup sour cream 3 Tbsp. Butter 2 Tbsp. Kahlua 1 <sup>1</sup>⁄<sub>2</sub> Cups XXXX sugar Cocoa for garnish

In large bowl, beat cream cheese, sour cream, butter and Kahlua until light and creamy. On low speed, gradually beat in XXXX sugar—about 1 to 2 minutes. Place in refrigerator to cool while cake cools. Spread top and sides with frosting. Refrigerate until ready to serve. Dust top with cocoa powder before serving. Donna Winburn
