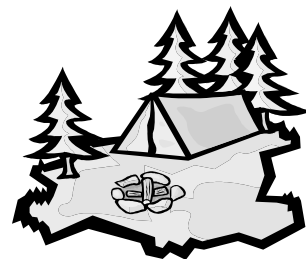

We will have the washhouse repaired and open in the Spring. The pool may not open until later in the Spring due to making State required repairs.

Please bundle and tie your limbs in 4' lengths, sack leaves, and don't put leaves in the ditches. Place the bagged leaves and tied limbs at the edge of your yard, and we will have them picked up.

## Peavy Reveals Road Delay

Just before press time, Pipeline interviewed Board Member, Richard Peavy, questioning the status of our roads contract and the starting schedule. As it turns out, Richard had just returned from an extensive conversation with the successful bidder, Northeast Georgia Paving Co. We got the latest information just before going to print, and *the news is not good!*

Like all of us impacted by high fuel prices, Northeast Paving is having asphalt-pricing problems! They are unable to secure a price for asphalt that will hold for the duration of our road work. As a result, Richard reports that Northeast is unable to provide firm pricing to us. The hurricanes Katrina and Rita have disrupted and destabilized petroleum product markets.

At this point, Northeast suggests that we delay the start of our road work until petroleum prices settle down. This will permit us to proceed at a later time (Spring?) knowing that the work can be completed within our budget.

Pipeline believes that this is far from the last word on this subject, but delay of some sort seems a certainty now.

## Recipe

### Sour Cream Banana Coffee Cake by Annette Boettger

1/2 Cup Butter  
1 Cup Sugar  
3 Eggs  
3 Cups Sifted Flour  
1 tsp. Soda  
1 1/2 tsp. Baking Powder  
1 tsp. Cinnamon  
1 tsp. Vanilla  
2 Large Bananas, mashed  
1/2 Cup Fat Free Sour Cream  
1/2 Cup Chopped walnuts

Cream together butter and sugar. Beat in eggs. Add remaining ingredients reserving a touch of cinnamon, sugar and nuts to sprinkle on top of batter. Bake in a 9 X 13 inch pan at 350 degrees for 35 to 40 minutes.
